COVID-19 EMERGENCY RELIEF



2020-2021

During COVID-19, WECO supported our partners in Cambodia and India with emergency food relief for communities living in extremely remote areas.



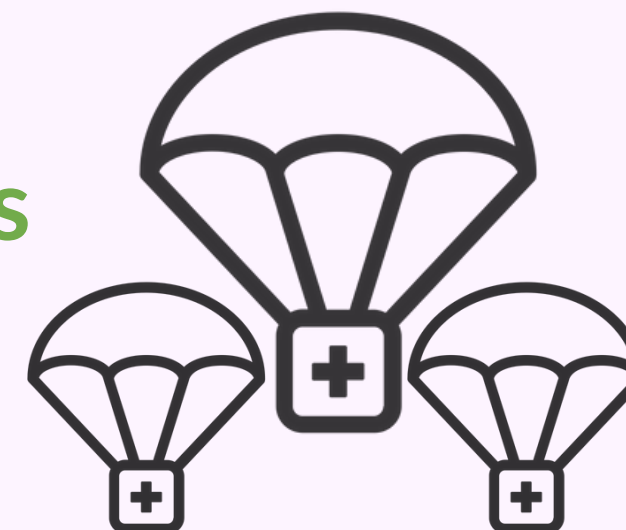
In total, we served over **1,200 families** with food, cooking, and medical supplies.

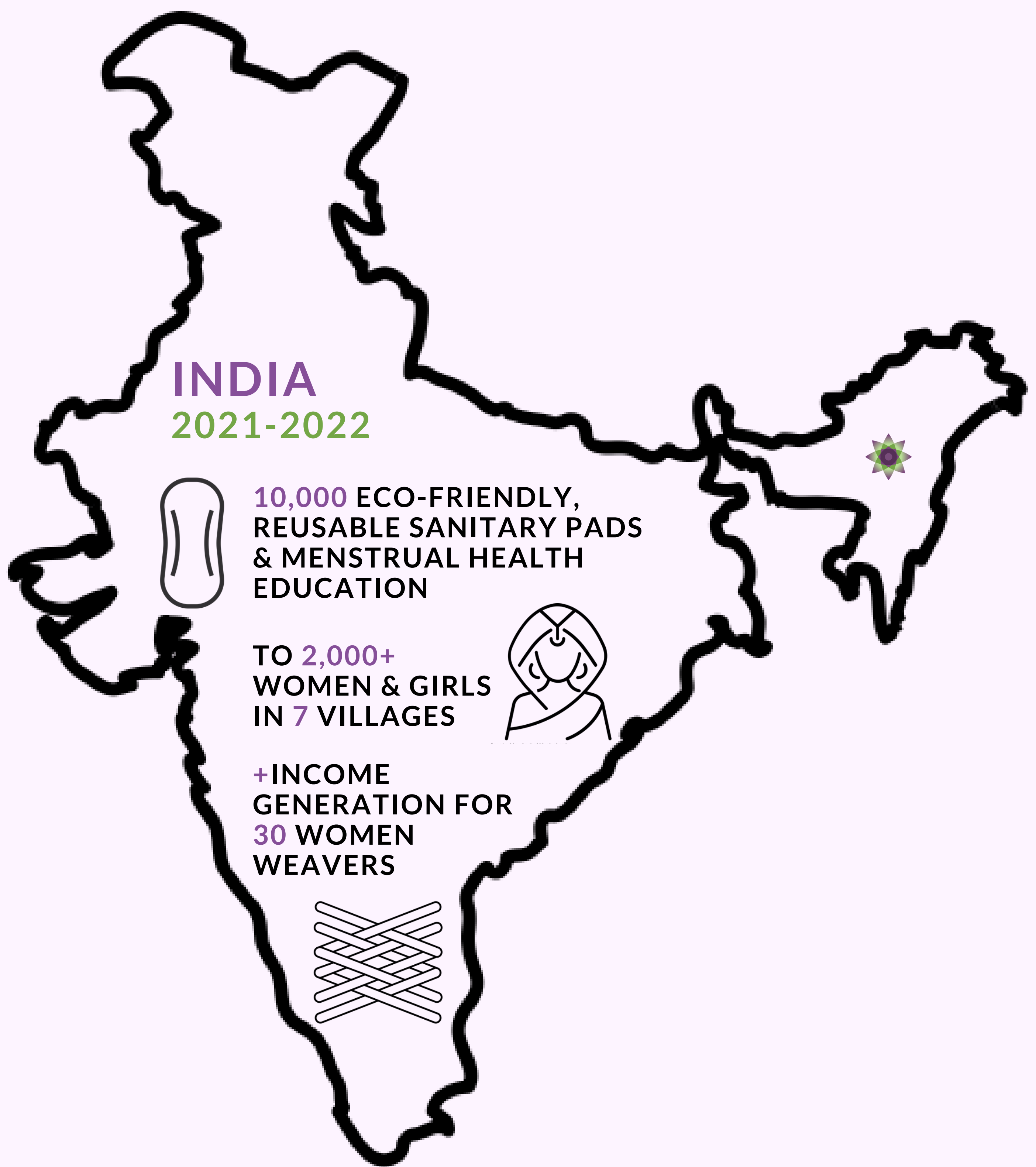
We provided **120 bags of rice** for PLF students and area food banks around Siem Reap, Cambodia.



We sent food, cooking, and medical supplies to **200 families** in Pong Ro and Ro Kayea villages, Cambodia.

We held COVID-19 testing and food distributions for **219 families** living in rural villages near Guwahati, India.





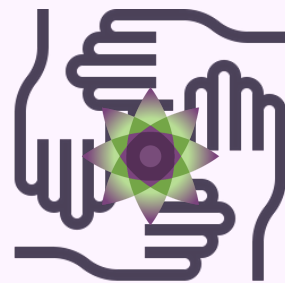
Since 2020, WECO has supported the creation and distribution of 10,000 eco-friendly, reusable sanitary pads for more than 2,000 women and girls living in rural villages near Guwahati.

In addition, since January 2021, WECO has been supporting an income generating initiative for 30 women weavers experiencing food insecurity from the impact of COVID-19. Weavers are paid a monthly salary to make textiles such as clothing and linens to sell in the market.

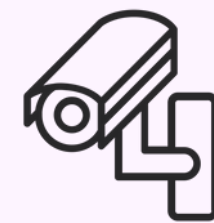
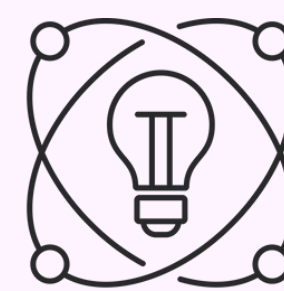

In 2021, WECO partnered with an association of 11 women coffee farmers (ASIPROFE) on constructing a communal micro-mill. The mill provides greater independence over coffee production and allows members to process coffee beans for export and local consumption. The members of ASIPROFE are leaders in their industry and represent one of only two women-led cooperatives in Costa Rica.

In partnership with local nonprofit Bean Voyage, WECO also supports the association through sustainable farming workshops, business development, along with personalized and peer-to-peer mentorship programs.
